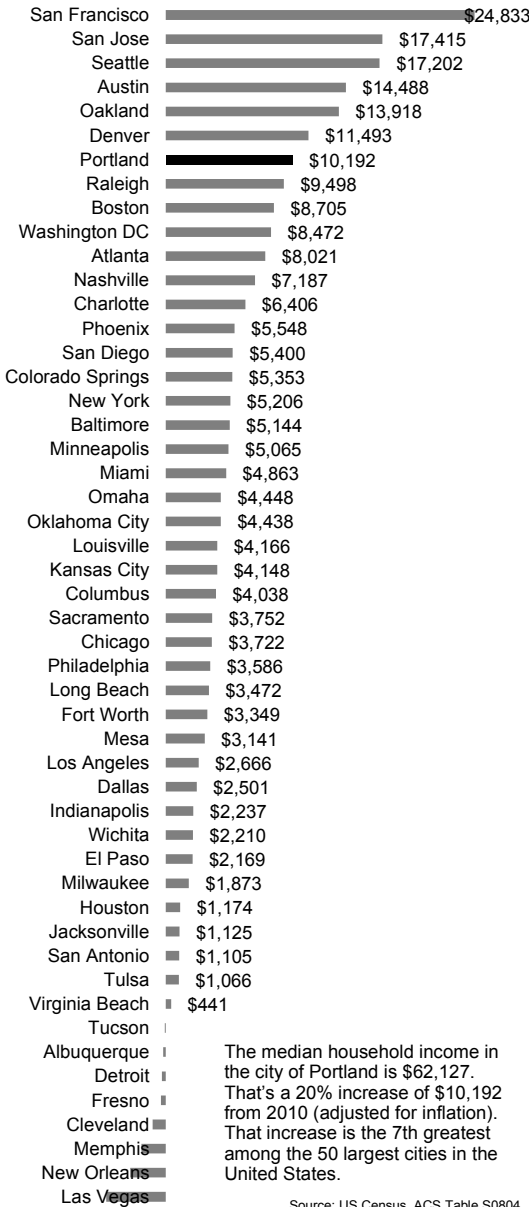


**Household Income Growth**

50 Largest US Cities : 2010 to 2016

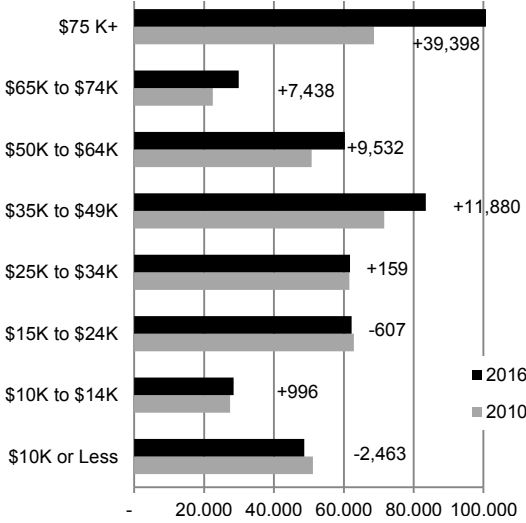


The median household income in the city of Portland is \$62,127. That's a 20% increase of \$10,192 from 2010 (adjusted for inflation). That increase is the 7th greatest among the 50 largest cities in the United States.

**Employment by Earnings Level**

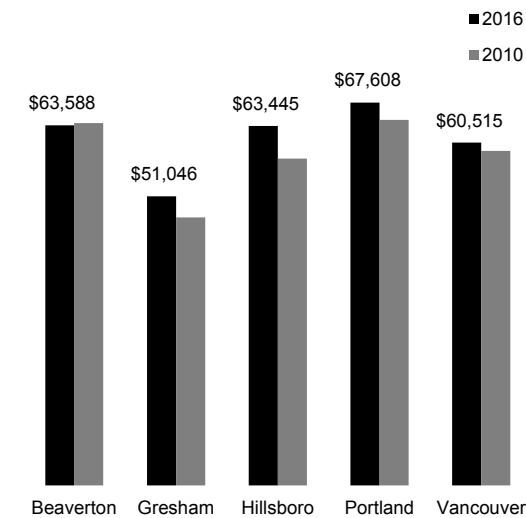
City of Portland - 2016 & 2010



Of the 66,000 new jobs created in the city of Portland since 2010, 59% of them earned \$75,000 or more. Meanwhile, jobs that paid less than \$35,000 saw almost no growth.

Inflation adjusted 2016 & 2010

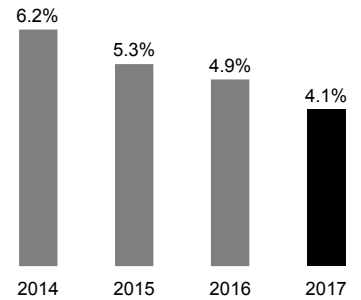


Since 2010, residents of Gresham and Hillsboro have enjoyed the fastest earnings growth, while Beaverton has seen no growth.
